B.S. IN COMMUNICATION SCIENCES AND DISORDERS

Communication Sciences and Disorders refers to the study of normal speech and hearing processes and their disorders. At the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center, the Communication Sciences and Disorders program refers to the undergraduate study that prepares individuals for graduate programs in Audiology, Education of the Deaf and Speech-Language Pathology.

This is a 2+2 program in which the first and second years (67 semester hours) may be completed at the University of Oklahoma Norman campus or any accredited college or university. The third and fourth years are completed at the Health Sciences Center.

GENERAL ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Have a minimum grade point average of 2.75 on a 4.0 scale for all college work attempted. Any work previously forgiven will be counted in the GPA for admission purposes. The College of Allied Health does not recognize academic forgiveness nor reprieve policies. All attempts of a course are included in the calculation of GPAs
- Provide contact information for three references as part of the online application.
- Be in good standing with previously attended or currently attending college or university.

PROFESSIONAL DEGREES M.A. SLP

There are two paths when entering the M.A. of SLP program.

- Regular entry – Applies to students with an undergrad degree in CSD
 - Two-year program consisting of 57 credit hours
- Lateral entry
 - Applies to students
 - Three-year program consisting of 86 credit hours
 - If the baccalaureate degree is not in CSD, admitted students will follow a seven-semester program

Four-year regular program
