Full Time Faculty Position

A unique opportunity is available to join strong and established physical and occupational therapy education programs at the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center (OUHSC). This 12-month tenure-track appointment involves teaching and research in neuroscience, neurology, movement science, neurorehabilitation, neurophysiology, pain science, or neuroanatomy. The University provides outstanding opportunities for faculty in an environment that encourages and supports innovation and interprofessional collaboration. Qualified applicants will also have an opportunity to become adjunct faculty in OUHSC's Center for Neuroscience. Funds are available to support research start-up costs. The awardee of this position will receive existing laboratory space with current technology dedicated to neurology research.

A PhD from an accredited university in an academic neuroscience related area is preferred. Teaching and research expertise in areas of neuroscience, neurorehabilitation, neurology, movement science, neurophysiology, pain science, or neuroanatomy with a record of scholarly publication and ability to obtain external funding are preferred.

Responsibilities include coordinating a professional course in neuroscience; instructing and advising in professional and post-professional courses with content in neurology, movement science, neurorehabilitation, neurophysiology, pain science, or neuroanatomy; research in the area of expertise; and service. We particularly seek faculty who can contribute to the research effort of the Department, College, and Health Sciences Center.

The Department of Rehabilitation Sciences has strong professional education programs with close collaboration between physical therapy, occupational therapy, and other OU Colleges. The entry level programs offer DPT and MOT degrees. The Department has excellent and established postprofessional Master's degree and Doctor of Science degree programs and an interdisciplinary PhD degree in Allied Health Sciences.

Oklahoma City offers a moderately low cost of living and very good quality of life. *Places Rated Almanac* cited Oklahoma City as one of the "best places to live in North America."

We encourage applications, expressions of interest, or nominations of others who may be qualified for this position. Applications will be accepted until the position is filled. Applications should include a current curriculum vita, a letter of application with qualifications, and a list of at least three references.
