Graduate credit hours = 55 hrs. Depending on a student's undergraduate coursework, an additional 3-9 credit hours of prerequisite courses may be required for regularly admitted MA students as follows: *If a student has not had a fluency course as an undergraduate, he/she will take it in the first fall semester of graduate study. **If a student has not had undergraduate coursework in the neural bases of communication, they will take it in this semester and take Voice Disorders in the last semester of coursework. A course in speech and hearing sciences is strongly recommended. Students admitted into the Lateral Entry curriculum pathway for the MA degree will complete 28 cr. hrs. of required prerequisite coursework before beginning the regular five-semester graduate sequence outlined here.
