

The Department of Communication Sciences and Disorders (CSD) at the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center (OUHSC) is seeking an individual with expertise in topics related to medical speech-language pathology (SLP), including voice and/or motor speech disorders, to fill a 12-month, full-time, consecutive term, faculty position at the rank of Assistant Professor starting in August, 2022, with some flexibility in start date and areas of interest possible.

Duties will include teaching undergraduate and graduate courses, providing clinical SLP services, and supervising graduate practica in one's areas of expertise. Duties will also include participating in collaborative scholarship or research, and contributing to departmental, college, and university service and governance. Required qualifications include an earned doctoral degree in Speech-Language Pathology or related field, evidence of successful university teaching, excellent interpersonal outreach and communication skills, and commitment to diversity, equity, and inclusion. Candidates with the potential to engage in collaborative work at a large, comprehensive health center are strongly encouraged to apply. Clinical credentials (CCC-SLP, Oklahoma SLP license) are required. Affiliations with other campus programs may be possible depending on an applicant's professional goals.

The Department of CSD is one of five academic departments within the College of Allied Health at the OUHSC. It is staffed by 14 full-time faculty members and offers four academic degree programs in speech-language pathology and in audiology: the pre-professional undergraduate degree (B.S. in CSD), two professional preparation degrees (M.A. in SLP, Au.D.), and the research degree (Ph.D. in either SLP or in Audiology). The department's professional preparation programs in speech-language pathology and in audiology are nationally accredited by the *Council on Academic Accreditation in Audiology and in Speech-Language Pathology*. The department is located within the recently completed Allied Health Building (AHB) on the OUHSC campus. Research laboratories, faculty offices, clinical facilities, and classrooms of all sizes within the AHB have been fitted with the latest technologies for research, academic teaching, and clinical instruction.
