In our entry-level professional programs, we are the only department in the country to offer integrated plans of study for our Doctor of Occupational Therapy (OTD) and Doctor of Physical Therapy (DPT) students. ADMISSIONS

Bachelor's degree required.

Minimum 2.75 cumulative GPA and minimum 2.75 Science GPA as calculated by PTCAS and OTCAS.

Additional admission requirements, including prerequisite courses and the application process, can be found on PTCAS, OTCAS, or through our Allied Health website

- The early application deadline in October each year fills up to half of the incoming class
- The final application deadline in February each year fills the remainder of the class.

The programs start in early June with a mandatory orientation the week prior.

The program has in-person locations in both Oklahoma City and Tulsa with students connecting virtually through classroom technology.



DOCTOR OF PHYSICAL THERAPY (DPT)

- Accredited through the American Physical Therapy Association
- The 3-year program consists of 108 hours over 9 semesters.
- Students are eligible to take the licensure exam in their final spring semester.
- 13 credit hours of clinical education over 4 semesters

- Applied: 470
- Admitted: 73
- GPA: 3.77
- Science GPA: 3.53
- GRE: 301, 4

DOCTOR OF OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY (OTD)

- Accredited through the American Occupational Therapy Association
- The 3-year program consists of 99 hours over 9 semesters.
- Students are eligible to take the licensure exam after their final spring semester.
- 13 credit hours of clinical education over 3 semesters

- Science GPA: 3.53
