Required Qualifications:

- Research-trained physical therapist with an earned post-professional doctoral degree (e.g., Ph.D., Ed.D. DSc, DrPH).
- Candidate must be licensed in Oklahoma or meet all eligibility requirements for Oklahoma licensure.

Preferred Qualifications:

- Preparation to serve as a research mentor to interdisciplinary peers.
- Educational, clinical, or research experience with pediatric or neurological conditions.
- Experience with teaching in an academic setting and three years of clinical experience.
- Evidence of active grant funding, and research/scholarly contributions to the physical therapy profession.
- Evidence of successful research mentoring of Ph.D. students, M.S. students, post-doctoral scholars, and/or early-career faculty.
- Evidence of service as national grant reviewer using national guidelines (e.g., for APTA, NIH, DoD, or NSF).
- Effective communication skills through engagement and reflection.
- Experience with course and curriculum design.
