

CLINCAL ASSISTANT PROFESSOR Speech-Language Pathology

Full–time, limited–term appointment for a 12–month faculty position within the Department of Communication Sciences and Disorders (CSD) in the College of Allied Health.

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS:

Applicants must possess, or be eligible for, Speech-language Pathology licensure in Oklahoma. Applicants must hold the Certificate of Clinical Competence in Speech-language Pathology (CCC-SLP) and have completed at least one year of successful work experience after earning the CCC-SLP. In addition, applicants must have completed at least two (2) hours of professional development in clinical instruction/supervision. Applicants should possess excellent communication, team building, problem-solving, and leadership skills.

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS:

Experience with pediatric diagnostics and treatment, and previous supervision experience.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

The primary responsibilities of this position include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Clinical supervision of student interns in the Speech Language Pathology graduate program,
- Continuous direct patient care within the John W. Keys Speech and Hearing Center,
- instruction of didactic coursework to undergraduate and professional students, and
- participation in the academic missions of the department, college, and university.

This is primarily a clinical position with service and teaching responsibilities appropriate to the applicant's experience and expertise.
