Required Qualifications:

- Occupational Therapist with an earned post-professional doctoral degree (e.g., OTD, Ph.D., Ed.D., D.Sc., DrPH) that prepares the candidate for teaching and research; candidates that will earn their doctorate by May of 2023 will be considered.
- The candidate must be licensed in Oklahoma or meet all eligibility requirements for Oklahoma licensure.

Preferred Qualifications:

- Contemporary knowledge in the Occupational Therapy Practice Framework, occupational therapy theories, and practice models.
- Educational, clinical, or research experience in adult neurorehabilitation, chronic conditions, and/or geriatrics.
- Educational, clinical, or research experience with occupation-based evaluation and treatment.
- Evidence of research/scholarly contributions to the profession (i.e., presentations and/or publications at local, state, or national level).
- Experience teaching in an academic setting and three years of clinical experience.
- Demonstrates effective communication skills.
- Strong skills in Microsoft Office Suite programs and openness to new technology.

Assistant or Associate Professor, Tenure Track or Consecutive Term Appointment

The Department of Rehabilitation Sciences in the College of Allied Health at the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center invites applications from occupational therapists with an earned post-professional doctorate to apply for a 12-month, full-time consecutive-term or tenure-track faculty appointment in our Occupational Therapy program.

The OUHSC OT program was founded in 1973. In 2000, our innovative OT and PT faculty launched an integrated, interprofessional curriculum and merged into the Department of Rehabilitation Sciences. In the summer of 2022, we enrolled our first cohort of OTD students, our last cohort of MOT students will graduate in May of 2024. Our program at the OUHSC campus enjoys the richness of collaboration with multiple disciplines across both the Tulsa and Oklahoma City campuses.

OUHSC combines teaching, research, and patient care at the highest level, and is home to seven health professional colleges offering a diverse community for students in the colleges of Allied Health, Dentistry, Medicine, Pharmacy, Nursing, and Public Health, as well as the Graduate College. Research collaborations are available throughout the university, including the National Cancer Institute-designated Stephenson Cancer Center, OU Health Harold Hamm Diabetes Center, Center for Geroscience and Healthy Brain Aging, the Oklahoma Clinical and Translational Science Institute, and many untapped opportunities in partnership with community agencies and organizations near campus.
