Candidates must have expertise and clinical experience in the area(s) of musculoskeletal and/or neurological (adult or pediatric) rehabilitation and meet all of the qualifications for obtaining licensure in the state of Oklahoma.

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS INCLUDE:

- Experience teaching in an academic or clinical setting
- Minimum of three to five years of clinical physical therapy experience with substantial time in area of expertise
- Record of involvement in professional associations
- Scholarly contributions to profession (e.g., presentations, publications)
- Strong skills in Microsoft Suite (e.g., Word, PowerPoint)
- Effective and reflective communication skills
- Evidence of innovative solutions for practice and/or community engagement
